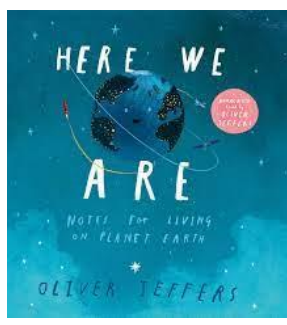
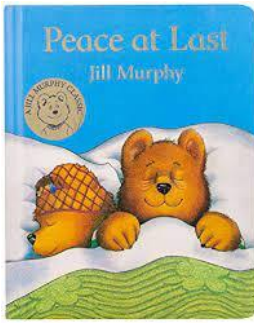

Message from 'TAKE SHELTER'

Hidden under the top playground at Downs Junior School is a 300-capacity WW2 air raid shelter. After the war the entrances were sealed and the shelter was left untouched for over 30 years, until it was re-discovered by workmen during a routine drain inspection in 1984. The underground museum includes video clips, 1940s themed rooms as well as rare local pictures, information and stories. We are extremely lucky to have a dedicated team of senior volunteers, who were all children during the the war, so are able to share their personal stories with visitors. Parent and carers attending our open morning will have a guided tour underground, and will be able to meet and chat with Alan David and Ann.
